



Penn State's B1G Bowl Revenue to Benefit Two Organizations

“As a University and as people within a caring community we believe it is essential to take a deeper look at the core issue of child sexual abuse and to openly acknowledge the scope of the problem. Our own experience shows that child sexual abuse greatly impacts individuals and entire communities,” said University President Rodney Erickson. It is now our responsibility to assist in raising awareness and in helping fight this insidious and often secret crime. We hope that our partnership will help break the silence that surrounds child sexual abuse and lead to better protection of our children.”

In order to take a deeper look at these core issues that President Erickson has acknowledged above, he has pledged all of Penn State's B1G bowl game revenue towards two organizations while continuing to maintain a partnership after the donation. The money will benefit the Pennsylvania Coalition Against Rape and the national Sexual Violence Resource Center. This is very exciting news, especially with [With Proud to be a Penn Stater](#) nearly reaching their **\$500,000** goal as well.

In total, the Pennsylvania Coalition Against Rape operates 51 rape crisis centers serving all 67 counties in the state. The funds donated will provide library resources, educational training, public awareness campaigns, and the operation of all of its centers. The Pennsylvania Coalition Against Rape is dedicated to educating all members of society about sexual violence while advocating for empowerment and better treatment of victims and survivors.
